

History and Location

The trail is steeped in history, with the recent discovery of Ancient Khoisan fish traps dating back between 2000 and 4500 years providing conclusive proof of the Khoisan's significant presence in the area.



Discover the rich wildlife and intertidal marine life that served as a major food source for the Khoi. Here one gets to stand where Bartolomeu Dias's squadron of three caravels rounded the Cabo de Roca in late February 1488, and Vasco da Gama entered Algoa Bay in December 1497, naming it Cabo do Arricife.

The vast number of shipwrecks led to the building of the Cape Recife Lighthouse from 1849 to 1851. The first light beamed across the ocean on 1 April of that year to warn passing ships of the dangers of Thunderbolt Reef, a natural hazard that has claimed many a ship and offers spectacular diving opportunities. Explore the Sea Hill Military Site, built during the Second World War to protect the Bay, and witness some of the most complete collections of surviving coast artillery buildings and equipment in South Africa.

Protecting this unique biodiversity and natural beauty for future generations is the 366-hectare Cape Recife Nature Reserve, proclaimed in 1973. And for a truly unforgettable experience, witness the annual migration of whales and dolphins within Gqeberha from some of the

reserve's best views.

- All plant and animal life is protected and must not be disturbed or harmed.
- · Please keep on the trail at all times.
- A minimum number of three persons is recommended as a safety precaution.
- · Please do not smoke or light fires while on the trail.
- · No dogs allowed. Do not litter.
- · Carry at least two litres of drinking water per person.
- Vehicle Entry past the boom requires an NMBM vehicle permit, available at Pine Lodge. A pass is required when visiting SANCCOB.
